

## Timeline...



2013 2014

- Concerns originally raised December 2013 pieces of dormer roof blew off the building in high winds!
- MCA recommend monitoring, investigation work and essential repairs to the fabric.
   Drone survey undertaken.

2015

- Further safety concerns were raised in October 2015, following limited high level inspection using a mobile access platform and steeplejacks.
- Remote monitoring system installed around the turrets and gables.

2016

- Sudden changes in readings from were recorded during high winds in early February 2016.

  Residents evacuated!
- Full internal and external scaffold erected.

  Further intrusive investigation undertaken, along with a measured survey of the fabric.
- Emergency works installed, allowing residents to return.
- September 2016 full scheme of roof repairs commence on site.


